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Principal's Message

CONFIRMATION

The Saturday after next the children in Year 6 will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation. The children have been preparing with their family and classmates over many months. This is an opportunity for the children, whose parents and Godparents made promises on their behalf when they were baptised, to confirm the baptismal promises made on their behalf.

On June 5, the children participated in a Retreat Day at Moonee Ponds, where they reflected on the sacrament and the Fruits and Gifts of the Holy Spirit. They were not only supported by the school staff but they were also supported by our new Bishop Rene Ramirez, Fr. Gerard and Fr. John. Bishop Rene spoke with the children about different elements of the sacrament to help them understand the significance of the commitment they were about to make.

The children have been working with Ms Ciampa, Mr. Kingston and Mr Jones throughout the year to investigate the significance this step in the children's faith journey has in each of their lives. We look forward to the children continuing to develop their gifts and share these with the community to benefit others. The children, with the support of their families and the community, will be celebrating the sacrament at 10:00am and 12 pm masses on June 28.

REPORTS

On Wednesday July 2 parents will be able to access Student Reports. This report provides feedback on your child's learning for Semester 1, 2025. The Essential Learnings contained in each of the curriculum areas are drawn from the Victorian Curriculum and identify the content and skills investigated throughout Semester 1. In conjunction with the Learning Conferences conducted in Term 1, the report is designed to document your child's achievement to date. Learning Conferences will again take place in Term 3 to further update parents on your child's progress. On June 2 an Audiri notice was sent to families with details of how to access the reports using the Nforma portal app. We ask that you ensure you have read the details so as to ensure you have access to the reports.

Supplementary reteach

One of the ways we support students with their learning is through a process called supplementary reteach. Supplementary reteach refers to providing additional or alternative instruction to students who haven't grasped a concept or skill after initial teaching. It is a targeted approach within a formative learning cycle, designed to address specific learning gaps and prevent the need for more intensive interventions. This may involve re explaining concepts, providing additional examples or using different teaching strategies.

Supplementary reteach is accessible to all students who need it at the point of need and involves the following elements:

- 1. Targeted instruction Supplementary reteach focuses on specific areas where students are struggling, rather than re-teaching the entire lesson.
- 2. Formative assessment it is informed by ongoing assessments that identify learning difficulties.
- 3. Small group and individualised reteach may be delivered in small groups or on an individual basis, depending on the student's needs.
- 4. Preventative it aims to address learning gaps early on, potentially preventing the need for more intensive interventions later

Supplementary reteach works in the following ways:

- 1. We identify needs teachers assess student understanding through various methods such as observations, quizzes or specific tasks.
- 2. Targeted re-explanation based on the assessments, teachers re-explain concepts or skills using different approaches, potentially breaking down complex ideas into smaller steps.
- 3. Practice and feedback students practice the targeted skill, and teachers provide immediate feedback to correct errors and reinforce correct understanding.
- 4. Modified materials supplementary materials, such as differentiated worksheets, or visual aids, may be used to support the reteach.

An example of this is as follows. If a student is struggling with fractions, a supplementary reteach might involve:

- Revisiting the definition of a fraction
- Using manipulatives
- Practicing with simplified examples
- Teacher provides immediate feedback, correcting errors and reinforcing correct understanding.


