Second Week of Advent

Theme:

Week 2 of Advent calls us to reflect on the peace of God.

Introduction:

The second candle is called the Bethlehem Candle to remind us of Jesus' birth and that his birth took place in a stable. The second candle also symbolizes faith with the "Bethlehem Candle" reminding us of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.

Reading: Gospel

Mk 1:1-8

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Make straight the paths of the Lord.

The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah:

Look, I am going to send my messenger before you;

he will prepare your way.

A voice cries in the wilderness:

Prepare a way for the Lord,

make his paths straight,

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and so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, 'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'

Father, when we pray we expect that you will give us everything we ask for. But sometimes we do not get what we want. Everyone expects that Jesus would have a royal birth, but instead he was born in an old stable. Help us to understand that following Jesus is often difficult and not what we expect. Amen.


Please note that you will need to register online with your **2020 photo code** to gain access to this year's images.


