Acts 2:1-11 -

#### Being a Spirit-filled person

Jesus said "It is the spirit that gives life, the flesh has nothing to offer. The words I have spoken to you are spirit and they are life." John 6:63

The Holy Spirit is sent by Jesus to remind the world of what Jesus taught and did.

Pentecost was the first time anyone had ever had God's Spirit inside them instead of just on them or with them. The first time the Holy Spirit came to live inside people was wildly obvious, but the Holy Spirit wasn't just for the first disciples.

He is in every single person who follows Jesus. He doesn't normally come in flames and wind, but he lives inside you, as the Helper Jesus promised to send.



They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak.

When Pentecost day came round, they had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.' #### Principal's Message

Next weekend, on Sunday June 19, the children in Year 6 will be celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation at the parish 9:30am mass and the 11:30am mass. This is a very special time in the children's faith development as they make the decision to undertake this sacrament and confirm the baptismal promises made on their behalf by their parents and godparents. It was great to see so many parents attend the Confirmation Information Evening held last week at the school. The weekend masses were also well attended by Year 6 families and their Prep buddy families in support of the children's preparation for this sacrament.

Bishop Terry together with Fr. Tony will confirm the children and we ask for the community to keep the children in your prayers as they prepare for this significant event in their faith journey.



#### **LEARNING CONFERENCES**

As you may have heard in the media recently many schools have been impacted by a variety of illnesses including COVID, flu and gastro. Our school is no exception to this but fortunately we have been able to manage staff so that classes can continue for the children. We appreciate that parents are keeping their children at home when they are unwell to help reduce the spread of any illnesses. We encourage you to continue to do this. With Learning Conferences coming up in the last week of school we are conscious that having the children in the hall together for an extended period of time whilst the conferences take place may increase the spread of these illnesses. Therefore, we are asking parents who are able, to collect their children at 1:00pm on June 21. We understand this is relatively short notice but we are responding to the situation that has developed recently with these illnesses. If parents are unable to arrange to collect their children, the children will be supervised in the hall, as has been the situation in previous years. So that the teachers know who will be remaining at school, we ask parents who are unable to pick up their children at 1:00pm to complete the Google form linked <u>here</u> by 12:00pm Monday June 20. We thank you for your understanding and support of these arrangements in advance as we endeavour to continue to provide a safe environment for the school community.

#### **DROP OFF/ PICK UP & PARKING**

Thank you to those families who are following the drop off and pick up arrangements and protocols which operate in Woodland Street and Rosebank Avenue. The vast majority of parents/grandparents/carers are following the practice of not leaving cars unattended in the pink zones and pulling up within the clearly marked bays. Unfortunately, we do have some families who do not believe the parking laws apply to them by dropping off/picking up in areas near but not within the allocated zones. This creates a danger to everyone.

Last week one of the crossing supervisors was abused by a family when they were asked to move their vehicle because it presented a hazard to others. The school and the crossing supervisors will not compromise the children's safety for the convenience of a few families in our community who chose to ignore to follow the expectations everyone else is fulfilling.

Council have been taking photos of cars breaching the parking laws and issuing fines in the mail. Please, for the safety of all in our community, abide by the traffic laws which operate around the school.

#### PARENT HELPER WORKSHOP

Last week Jo Power and Nicole Kaso facilitated the Parent Helper Workshop for those parents who want to help out in the classroom and support the children. Thank you to those parents who attended the workshop and were so enthusiastic in the different activities they were involved in. Over the coming weeks teachers will be communicating with parents about your availability to help in the classroom.

#### **Reconciliation Week**

May 27th to June 3rd was Reconciliation Week. Reconciliation Week allows us to celebrate Indiginous history and culture and foster reconciliation discussion and activities. This year's theme is 'Be Brave. Make Change' and some of the Year 3 students explored this during a Wellbeing lesson.



The theme challenges all Australians to *Be Brave* and tackle the unfinished business of reconciliation so we can *Make Change* for the benefit of all Australians.

The session started with an insightful discussion and then led to students completing their own independent inquiries. Some students decided to research more into Indiginous music and dance whilst others decided to explore the Acknowledgement of Country and what this means. Every student discussed the Aboriginal Flag and used the colours to decorate their own stick.









Some students decided to explore Indiginous symbols and create some of their own, whilst others created posters from the information they researched.

Embracing the Indiginous culture is an important part of what we do here at St Vincents and the empathy and compassion shown by the children is admirable. We look forward to exploring this topic further.
