
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Reflection

Reading: Gospel

Matthew 24:37-44 The Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect

For in those days before the Flood people were eating, drinking, taking wives, taking husbands, right up to the day Noah went into the ark, and they suspected nothing till the Flood came and swept all away. Prayer

What is Advent?

In the Catholic Church, Advent is a period of preparation extending over the four Sundays before Christmas. The word Advent comes from the Latin advenio, "to come to," and refers to the coming of Christ. And the term the coming includes three references: first of all, to our celebration of Christ's birth at Christmas; second, to the coming of Christ in our lives through grace and the Sacrament of Holy Communion; and finally, to his second coming at the end of time. Advent is not just about encountering Jesus as a baby, it is about encountering Jesus today.


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Principal's Message (continued)



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
Reminder to Download Reports & Portfolios




Dear Parents
