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Reflection



Throughout this term most of the students have been learning about ways to make our world a more sustainable place and the roles that we, as human beings, have, in caring for our world. Within this learning we have focused on a letter (encyclical) written by Pope Francis in 2015, called Laudato Si. Laudato Si means 'Praise be to you'.

Pope Francis' encyclical was written about the care for our common home. It encourages us to reflect on the values we share and create a more just and sustainable future, to "hear both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor" (n. 49).

Laudato Si has been welcomed as a document that calls upon all of humanity, prompting people around the world to reflect more deeply on our Creator and creation.

The students have learnt that by being a part of creation, made in the image and likeness of God, allows a deeper understanding of the connection between us and God, and also God's Creation.





A special prayer within the encyclical is titled:

The Canticle of Creatures (St. Francis)

Most High, all-powerful, good Lord,
Yours are the praises, the glory,
and the honour and all blessing.
To You alone, Most High, do they belong
and no human is worthy to mention Your name.

Praised be you, my Lord,
with all Your creatures,
especially Sir Brother Sun,
who is the day,
and through whom You give us light.
And he is beautiful
and radiant with great splendour;
and bears a likeness of You, Most High one.

Praised be You, my Lord,
through Sister Moon and the stars,
in heaven You formed them
clear and precious and beautiful.
Praised be You, my Lord,
through Brother Wind,
and through the air, cloudy and serene,
and every kind of weather
through which you give substance to your creatures.

SCHOOL REVIEW

Last week the school reviewer Leslie Tulloch completed her review of the school. This involved meeting with staff, students and parents to understand the strengths of the school and possible areas for improvement. Once the new strategic plan has been created this will be shared with the school community as it will contain the goals the school will be working towards over the next 4 years.

INTERVIEWS FOR 2024 PREP FAMILIES

DEIDRE BRANDNER

One of the consequences of the COVID pandemic has been a significant increase in the anxiety levels of some children. Our school community has not been immune to this impact. To help guide parents to support children who may be experiencing anxiety the school has engaged Deidre Brandner to share her expertise with parents about using strategies with children to help cope with anxiety. Children will feel anxious at different times and in different situations so this information session is for all parents. Deidre has over 30 years experiences as a psychologist and more recently a published author. She brings a wealth of knowledge and experience in working with children not only from our school but from schools throughout Melbourne.

I would encourage every parent to attend this evening session as this is an opportunity that should not be missed.

STUDENT LUNCHES & PICKING UP FROM SCHOOL EARLY

A reminder that we ask parents to ensure children have their lunch with them when they come to school at the beginning of the day rather than dropping lunch off during the day.

We also ask that parents endeavour to organise appointments for children outside of school hours whenever possible.

This will help reduce the interruptions to all the children's learning that these situations can create.

CHESS CLUB

The school has had a number of students show interest in having a Chess Club at school where they can learn strategies to play the game. Chess in Schools is an organisation which facilitates lessons during lunchtimes for children interested in this activity. Their goal is 'to inspire and motivate students to enjoy the many benefits of chess and develop a love for the game'. The cost of the program is \$135 per term. To gauge whether there is enough interest in the program, Chess in Schools is conducting a free lunchtime session on Thursday June 15. More information about the program will be provided in the next newsletter. If this is something you would like your child to be part of as an extracurricular activity they have the opportunity to 'try-before-they-buy' through attending the free incursion.

A huge thank you to all of the parents who helped to make this event so special. Events like this confirm the fabulous community that we have here at St Vincent's.
















The Resilience Project


This week, our Year 5 students completed a Resilience Project lesson entitled - Supporting Others. The learning intention of this lesson was to understand the benefits of showing empathy. Students were defining empathy and recognising the benefits of showing empathy. They watched the following video and discussed how kindness comes back to you if that is how you treat others: https://youtu.be/SiJdoZHqr11

The students discussed the statement 'Empathy is most beneficial for the receiver' and decided if they agreed or disagreed. It was an interesting discussion and comments included:

- "Helping others makes them feel better"
- 'What goes around comes around'
- 'It feels nice to show kindness. The giver receives double the kindness'

The discussion allowed them to hear the perspective of others and this is a skill they are currently focussing on in Inquiry. It was terrific to hear their ideas and discussions around this important topic.
