

Reflection



The Year 4 students are continuing to prepare for their First Holy Communion, and we ask the school community to pray for the students at this time.

For those students receiving First Holy Communion for the first time, this is a very special occasion. The word Communion tells us something very important about the Eucharist. It tells us that when we receive Communion we are united with Jesus. That means being as close to Him as we can be. It means sharing His love and His life.

The students have been focusing on the transformation that occurs during the Mass when the bread and wine is changed into the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. The students have then focused on the transformation that takes place within themselves, once they too, have received their First Holy Communion.

Prayer for the students receiving First Holy Communion: Lord Jesus, Bless the children coming forward to receive Holy Communion for the first time. May it be an initial step into a life-long love of the Eucharist. Give them a hunger for this sacred food so that they turn to you for comfort, guidance, and wisdom as they grow into full discipleship. We ask this through Christ, our Lord. Amen

Connection with the Last Supper to today's Mass:

At the Last Supper, Jesus thanked God for the bread and shared it with the disciples and said, "Take this and eat it. This is my body which is given for you". Then He took a full cup, thanked God for it and said, "This is my blood, which will be poured out for many people so their sins may be forgiven. Do this in memorial of me." These words are the same words spoken at our Mass today, when we celebrate the Eucharist. This is an important part of our Catholic faith, which brings us closer to God.

food containers, drink bottles etc).



Wednesday 13th September - Pupil Free Day

TheirCare will be running a pupil free day on Wednesday 13th September from 7am-6pm in the school hall. Breakfast will be served until 8:15am on this day.

As we are a **NUT FREE ZONE**, we kindly ask not to send sandwiches or other snack foods that contain nuts to the service this including (muesli bars, Nutella snacks, kinder chocolates etc). If nut items are found in your child's lunchbox they will be removed and not able to be consumed.

What to bring?

- Lunchbox with fruits and nut free snacks as well as some lunch
- Drink Bottle
- Closed toe shoes are to be worn.
- Casual clothes may be worn on this day.

We also ask parents to please leave any special toys at home to prevent things getting lost or mixed up with other children's items.
