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Reflection



1st Sunday of Advent



This Sunday marks the beginning of Advent. Jesus warns his disciples to be vigilant, to stay awake. This is not just a call for the disciples of Jesus' time but for us today. Life is full of unpredictable events, both tragic and joyful.

Gospel - Mark 13:33-37

If he comes unexpectedly, he must not find you asleep

Jesus said to his disciples: 'Be on your guard, stay awake, because you never know when the time will come. It is like a man travelling abroad: he has gone from home, and left his servants in charge, each with his own task; and he has told the doorkeeper to stay awake. So stay awake, because you do not know when the master of the house is coming, evening, midnight, cockcrow, dawn; if he comes unexpectedly, he must not find you asleep. And what I say to you I say to all: Stay awake!'

Reflection on the Gospel reading:

At times, we can be impatient with God's plan. We wander. We choose our own plans instead. God is faithful though. He calls us to return to Him. God's plan is not about getting what we want. It is about God restoring the whole world to himself. In our lives we will experience events which we don't understand.

There will be senseless tragedies and undeserved triumphs. We must be vigilant and ready for those, especially for trials and difficulties. There are always uncertainties in life. We must be ready at all times to serve Christ when we encounter the Lord in our daily lives.

Mass readings for the 1st Sunday of Advent:

- First Reading Isaiah 63:16B-17, 19B; 64:2-7: "No ear has ever heard, no eye ever seen, any God but you doing such deeds for those who wait for him."
- Responsorial Psalm Psalm 80: "Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved."
- Second Reading 1 Corinthians 1:3-9: "He will keep you firm to the end, irreproachable on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ."
- Gospel Mark 13:33-37: "Watch, therefore; you do not know when the Lord of the house is coming, whether in the evening, or at midnight, or at dawn, or in the morning. May he not come suddenly and find you sleeping."

Reflection Questions for the 1st Sunday of Advent Year B

- How can I use the good things in my life to serve others?
- When are some times when I had to lean on others and let them be Christ for me?
- What can I do to be more prepared to serve God in the ups and downs of life?

PARENTS ASSOCIATION YEAR LEVEL REPS

In preparation for 2024 the school is asking for parent volunteers to be Parents Rep on the Parents Association for 2024. The Parents Association plays such an important role in our school community and the success of events is dependent on the volunteers and the role that the Parents Reps play is vital.

TRANSITION DAY

On Wednesday December 13, children will meet their 2024 classroom teacher. Details will be sent home about the classroom teachers for 2024 on the same day.

SCHOOL PICNIC

Our school picnic will take place on Thursday December 14. Children will walk to Woodlands Park and be involved in a number of activities on the day. Parents are welcome to attend and each class is looking for volunteers to walk down to the park with the children. If you are able to volunteer we ask that you indicate this on your child's online excursion consent form.

FINAL ASSEMBLY

The Final Assembly for the year will be held at 12 noon on Friday December 15 in the hall. This will be an opportunity to farewell our graduating Year 6 children and other families who are leaving the school.

REPORTS

The Student Reports will be available to access through the Parent Portal on Wednesday December 13. The teachers have been very busy collating data and identifying achievement levels of all students. This involves taking data from standardised testing including PAT-Maths and PAT-Reading, Fountas and Pinnell Reading Assessment and Essential Assessment. The teachers also use pre and post data from units covered as well as anecdotal notes recorded throughout the semester. This extensive data is combined to give an accurate assessment of each child's level of learning. Details have recently been sent to parents via the Audiri app to explain how to access the Parent Portal.

BEGINNING OF 2024 SCHOOL YEAR

Next year the school will again begin the year with testing children on their understanding of Mathematics. The Maths Online Interview (MOI) was completed at the beginning of this school year and provided important information on each student's strengths and challenges in this curriculum area. This testing will be conducted on Tuesday January 30 & Wednesday January 31 for all children in Years 1-6. Therefore, for children in Years 1-6, the first day of school will be Thursday, February 1.

Details of how to book your child in for testing on the Tuesday and Wednesday will be provided in coming newsletters. It is important that children are available for this testing as it guides the teaching and goal setting for each and every student.

Prep children will begin school on Tuesday January 30. Testing for the Prep children will take place on Wednesdays during the month of February.

CLOSURE DAY

A reminder that Wednesday December 6 is a closure day with staff involved in planning for the 2024 school year.

As a school community, we will be supporting the St. Vincent de Paul Society Christmas Appeal.


We are hoping that each family will consider donating **ONE** item per family from the following list:

Transitions

Each and every day, all of us experience many transitions. From home to school, bell times, moving from one class to the next, school to home, changes to a TV program, having visitors and bed time are just a few. Some people find transitions more challenging than others and transitions may appear more difficult on some days or in some places due to other pressure and expectations. Each young person will cope with transitions and change in different ways and some transitions will require more detailed planning than others.


With the transition of 2024 approaching, I thought I would offer some advice to ensure a smooth process.

Executive functioning can have an impact on how a young person copes with changes and transitions and we can teach

executive functioning skills to our students.

Executive functioning skills are performed by our brain and help us to control and manage our thoughts and actions.

Teaching executive functioning skills includes showing children how to use a planner, helping them to create checklists for everyday tasks, setting time limits, establishing a routine and using a reward system.




To enable a smooth transition, the following steps can help to ease any worries your child might have:

- Take a photo of the new environment, the people who will be there and the activities they may be asked to do
- Use a diary or calendar to countdown the days/weeks leading up to the change
- Meet up with other students in the class over the break
- Wake up slightly earlier on the days leading up to the first day to avoid rushing
- Wear in any new shoes in the days leading up to the first day
- Use visual aids at home to support organisation
- Use social stories to talk about the first day
- Practice the school routine beforehand
- Practice packing lunchbox

Reminder to Download Reports & Portfolios


Parents of students who are leaving the school are reminded to download and archive reports and portfolios (ie from nForma and SeeSaw) before the end of the year while there is still access to these documents.
