Principal's Message

It is great to see we already have so many parents who have volunteered as Parent Reps as part of the Parents Association. The PA plays a very important role within the school community of fundraising and providing opportunities for social gatherings. For events that the PA organise to be successful, they need the support of parents to volunteer. Each year level is responsible for particular events and if we do not have volunteers then the events cannot run. The PA currently have some vacancies for Parents Reps and I would encourage parents to help share the load by volunteering for one of the roles. Our community is strong because busy parents see how volunteering in the school has such a positive impact on the children and the community.

PREP & YEAR 6 FAMILY PICNIC

On Thursday, February 22, we invite all Prep and Year 6 families to a picnic in the Senior Yard. This is an opportunity to welcome the Prep children to the school and for the Year 6 and Prep families to meet their buddy's family. The picnic begins at 6:00pm and finishes at 8:00pm. The Parents Association will be providing sausages with salad/coleslaw for parents and children. It is a BYO event for everything else including drinks and picnic rugs/chairs.

We look forward to seeing all our Prep and Year 6 families attend this event which will be held in the Senior Yard. We ask Year Prep and Year 6 families to complete the form sent out on Audiri indicating the number of adults and children attending for catering purposes. Siblings of Year Prep and Year 6 children are also invited to attend.

RECONCILIATION INFORMATION NIGHT

This term the children in Year 3 will be making the Sacrament of Reconciliation. As part of their preparation the children and their parents will be participating in the Reconciliation Information Evening on February 28 beginning at 7:00pm. The session will run for approximately an hour and families will be provided with details of the sacrament celebration. We look forward to seeing parents and the Year 3 children at the meeting.

SUPPORT SERVICES

This year the school has engaged a speech pathologist from Speech Pathology for Schools to provide evidence-based speech pathology intervention to students. Melanie Raffa will be working in the school 2 days a week and is another element of the school's commitment to support students using both the expertise of the staff and other professionals. Contained in today's newsletter is the first of a number of strategies suggested by Speech Pathology for Schools, that parents may find helpful. Melanie's role adds to the extensive support services the school has in place.

The network includes:

 Cameron Lee is our school counsellor who has been working in the school for the past 2 years. Cam is a qualified psychologist who has worked with a number of students in his time at the school.

- Jess McLeod is the school's intervention teacher who works with children from the Junior classes to support them with their literacy development.
- Nicole Kaso also works in intervention supporting those children with particular mathematics needs.
- Stephanie Serrano also works with children whose data indicates that they need additional extension support.
- 15 Learning Support Officers work throughout the school to support children in their learning
- Rebecca Glenton, as the school's Learning Diversity Leader, works with these people, classroom teachers, LSOs and other personnel from Melbourne Archdiocese Schools (MACS) to ensure the school is providing support for students to achieve success in their learning.

To access these services the school examines data from the children's learning and any allied health reports received. There is a referral process which takes into account all the data available before deciding which students would benefit most from one of the services outlined. The process does take into account information provided by parents but the access to the services is not based on parents requesting access to a particular service.

LEARNING CONFERENCES

This year the learning conferences will be held on March 26 and will be an opportunity for parents to receive feedback on their children's progress. Children are expected to attend the learning conferences with their parent(s). The school will be closed on this day with the learning conferences beginning at 11:00am and concluding at 6:00pm. More details on how to book for the conferences will be made available in the coming weeks.

ASSEMBLY

The first Friday assembly will take place on February 23 beginning at 2:30pm in the hall. The Year Six students will be presented with their leadership badges and Bomber jackets at the assembly. Parents are welcome to attend.

SWIMMING SPORTS

On Thursday February 29 the School Swimming Sports will take place at Oak Park Pool. The Year 3-6 events will begin at 9:40am and Prep-Yr 2 events will begin at 11:00am. Children are asked to wear their bathers underneath their sports uniform. Children can also wear thongs, sandals or Crocs to school and are encouraged to wear their team's colour as a T-shirt/top (no singlet tops). The day caters for the variety of children's swimming abilities and experience.

With the current notification requirements for cancelling buses, a decision on whether the swimming carnival goes ahead will be made on Tuesday February 27 should an unfavourable weather forecast be predicted. Parents will be notified by Wednesday February 28.

GENERAL REMINDERS

Now that we have had a few weeks to settle into the normal routine, I would like parents to assist the efficient running of the school by following a few important procedures that will ensure the safety of all children:

- ❖ No car parking in the church car park
- Supervision of the children in the Junior Yard commences at 8:30am and this is when the gates will be opened. The school concludes at the end of the day 3:20pm. Children needing supervision outside these times should access the Before and After Care Program.
- Children should have a clear understanding about pick-up points at the end of the day.
- Observe all parking restrictions and school zone speed limits around our school.
- If dropping children off after the start of the school day please ensure they are dropped off at the office, signed in by a parent/guardian and a Late Pass is obtained.

EARLY DEPARTURES

In the past 2 years the school has noticed a significant increase in the number of children being collected from school early or leaving for appointments. As a school we understand that there are sometimes exceptional reasons for a student needing to leave early or to attend an appointment. This does cause interruption to the class, the child's learning and the other children's learning. We ask parents to avoid making appointments for their children during the day where possible. Should your child need to leave the school we ask that you notify your child's classroom teacher by the morning of the early departure day. Also, on Friday's when the school has an assembly, should you need to collect your child early because of exceptional circumstances we ask that you ensure that this is done prior to the assembly.

SCHOOL ADVISORY COUNCIL

Tonight the School Advisory Council will meet for the first time this year. The council operate under the Terms of Reference developed with the council in previous years and in line with Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS). The following is taken from the Terms of Reference which outlines the role of the council.

The School Advisory Council provides a forum for discussion and discernment, where the parent/guardian voice and perspective are available to inform and support the decisions made by the principal and parish priest for the good of school and parish where the wellbeing and outcomes for students is paramount.



Understanding the Brain

Have you ever experienced your toddler throwing a tantrum in the supermarket, or your Prep child refusing to get dressed? Perhaps your Year 5 student was sulking on a bench in the park instead of playing with their friends. The truth is, we will all experience these moments with our children because their developing brains are complex.

The upstairs brain makes decisions and manages emotions and is under construction until the mid 20s. Especially in young children, the downstairs brain and its emotions tend to rule over the logic of the left brain and this is why children often seem and feel so out of control. Children need us in these moments to support them, make them feel safe, give them time and ultimately only talk through challenges when they are ready and in their upstairs brain.




Some strategies to help children when they are downstairs include:

- 1. Name it to tame it name the emotions and appeal to the upstairs brain for words and reasoning
- 2. Engage don't enrage keep your child thinking and listening, instead of purely reacting
- 3. Move it or lose it Use physical activities to shift your child's emotional state
- 4. Let the clouds of emotion roll by Help them understand that emotions come and go
- 5. SIFT Help children pay attention to Sensations. Images,

SPS Speech Box

Supporting re-telling skills The benefits of talking about your day.



Talking with children is important because it builds their language and communication skills. By creating opportunities for your child to retell stories you can boost your child's understanding of how stories work. This is a great way to build their listening comprehension (listening and understanding), early literacy, vocabulary and help them to put sentences together correctly and use correct grammar. Research shows that supporting the re-telling of personal experiences is an important tool in language development (Saunders & Goldenberg, 1999).

When you go on an outing with your child take a few photos of what's happening around you. For example, during a trip to the farm, take photos as your child feeds the animals, goes on a ride, or eats lunch. Later, look at the photos together and use them to help guide your child to retell what happened at the farm. By placing the pictures in an order, like a story, you can teach your child about the sequence of events and words they can use to help them retell stories, such as the words 'first', 'next', and 'last'. This activity can also help your child to use joining words in their sentences like 'and' and 'because' and use specific vocabulary related to the event. You could create your own personalised book in this similar manner, which is another idea to support your child's language development at home in a fun and personal way.

Each day when you get home, ask your child, "How was your day?". Help them get started by giving them some ideas and sentence starters such as: "Today at school I learned...", "At recess I ...", "For lunch I ate...", "My favourite thing about today was...."

Do the same task by re-telling your own day so your child hears a model. This routine not only helps your child get better at talking, listening, and understanding, but also creates a nice way for both of you to share your day.

Walk to School initiative - MOVE IN MARCH

At St. Vincent's, we encourage students and families to walk/ride or scoot to school to stay active, healthy and minimise traffic congestion around the school during school drop off and pick up time. During the month of March, we have signed up to be a part of the MOVE IN MARCH initiative through the Moonee Valley Council. This involves encouraging as many students and families as possible to walk, ride or scoot to school. - Any family experiencing <u>severe</u> financial hardship

- Any family identified as refugees and holding an ImmiCard Families who meet one of the above criteria are required to return the below documentation to the office:
- Concessional Fee Application Form
- A completed direct debit request service agreement
- A copy of the government concession card (if applicable)
- A completed Camps, Sports and Excursions (CSEF) application form (if applicable)

2024 Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund (CSEF) helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the cost of school trips, camp and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested <u>CONCESSION CARD</u> or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

\$150 per primary school students

\$250 per secondary school students

We would encourage all parents who do have a concession card to apply for this benefit as, apart from receiving the CSEF payment, it also impacts on the school student funding.


- Open the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store and search for 'Audiri'. Install the app.




