As a renowned Australian child psychologist, author, and parenting expert, Deirdre Brandner has devoted over 30 years to serving children, adolescents, and their families. Deirdre last presented at the school in 2023 and the feedback from parents who attended was overwhelmingly very positive and some of the best advice some parents had ever had. Parents who were not able to attend were very disappointed once they found out how beneficial it was to their parenting. In this seminar Deidre will support parents in harnessing their child's attention and focus, enabling them to excel academically and in all aspects of life. STATIONS OF THE CROSS

This year our Stations of the Cross will be held on Wednesday, April 2. At this important event, each grade takes on the responsibility of presenting one of the Stations of the Cross. This is one of our school traditions and gives all in our community a chance to reflect on Easter and the sacrifice Jesus made. The event will commence at 11:45am in the senior yard and the area around the church. Parents are invited to attend. This is a very solemn and reverent recount of the events leading up to and including Jesus' death and resurrection.

EXPLICIT DIRECT INSTRUCTION

Last week Prep parents attended a session presented by Nicole Kaso and Deann Keane about numeracy and literacy. One of the areas they included in their presentation is 'How is a Mathematics Lesson Structured?' The following details provide an understanding of how teachers are structuring their Mathematics lessons.

- Present material in small steps: By breaking down a task into small, sequential steps, students are less likely to experience a cognitive overload as they're not having to pay attention to too much information at once.
- Provide models and worked examples: Providing students with a framework of what information they should include, students are less likely to learn redundant information. This frees up space in their working memory so they can focus on other things.
- Check for student understanding: Regularly assessing students' understanding before presenting new information means misconceptions can be addressed and students have time to process and transfer this information into their long-term memory.
- Provide scaffolding: Supporting students until they are confident with a topic reduces the stress placed on their working memory. This way, students aren't overwhelmed by the new topic.

Speech Box

Fun: A vital ingredient for building your child's vocabulary



Research has shown that children learn how to communicate best when engaging in enjoyable & longer interactions with their caregivers. In childhood, learning goes hand-in- hand with play.

Children are more likely to learn vocabulary that relates to their interests and curiosities. Having fun with your child has the potential to significantly improve your child's interactions and communication skills. After you discover what excites your child, here is how you can incorporate these interests into your interactions:

- 1. Let your child lead and be responsive to their initiations. Be sure to respond quickly and positively. For example: "Wow, that's a really fast car!".
- 2. Your positive and quick responses can support your child in continuing with the interaction, allowing more communicative exchanges and vocabulary building!
- 3. Researchers suggest avoiding toys, games, and electronic books with flashing lights, loud noises, or long pre-recorded songs, as they can make interactions more challenging. Instead, encourage imaginative play, such as dress-ups, outdoor play, and building activities like Lego, to support vocabulary development.
- 4. Your child may have sensory preferences that make certain activities better choices for encouraging communication than others. By following your child's interests and preferences, you are providing a space for your child to develop language through what is fun for them. Some ideas could include playing with sand, slime, foam or play-dough.

Fun encourages an interaction to have more 'turns', or back-and-forth exchanges, which creates more opportunities for vocabulary learning. When you tune into your child's interests and curiosities, research shows that language learning will flourish.




