Year 6 Visit to Mary MacKillop Spirituality Centre –



Focus: Faith in Action



On Monday our Year 6 students had the wonderful opportunity to visit the Mary MacKillop Spirituality Centre in Fitzroy. The experience gave them a chance to step into the story of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, Australia's first saint, and learn how her life continues to inspire people today.

Through prayer, reflection and hands-on activities, the students explored Mary MacKillop's deep faith in God and her commitment to serving those most in need. They discovered how Mary lived out her motto, "Never see a need without doing something about it," and were encouraged to think about how they, too, can put their faith into action in everyday life.

The day supported the student's understanding of how living like Mary MacKillop means showing kindness, standing up for what is right, and making a difference in the lives of others.

Statue of Mary MacKillop at ACU Melbourne

At the Australian Catholic University (Fitzroy), there is a statue of Mary MacKillop in St Mary of the Cross Square, right across the road from where she was born.

The statue, created by artist Louis Laumen in 2013, shows a young Mary holding a book to symbolise her love of learning and teaching, with a dove of peace beside her. She looks across Brunswick Street towards her birthplace, reminding us of her beginnings.

Bronze plaques around the square tell the story of her life and lead visitors towards the St Mary of the Cross Chapel, a space for prayer and reflection.

The statue encourages everyone who visits to live like Mary, with faith, courage and care for others.




Prep Wellbeing: Personal Space, Politeness, and Inclusion

This week in Prep, students participated in a wellbeing lesson designed to develop important social and emotional skills. The focus of the session was on three key areas: respecting personal space, using polite and considerate language, and ensuring that everyone feels included in games and activities.

The lesson began with an introduction to the concept of personal space, illustrated through the use of bubbles. Students learned that, just like each bubble has its own space, every person has an "invisible bubble" that should be respected. Through picture sorting activities, children practised identifying appropriate "hands on" and "hands off" behaviours.


Students then explored the power of words in building positive relationships. By sorting words and phrases into "kind" and "unkind," they identified which expressions help others feel safe and valued. Role-play activities provided opportunities to practise the use of polite phrases such as "please," "thank you," and "sorry" in meaningful contexts.


The lesson concluded with an inclusion activity in which students played a circle game, rolling a ball to different classmates while offering a kind word. This reinforced the importance of ensuring that no one is left out and that every individual feels a sense of belonging.




Three picture story books were the focus of the lessons with King Of The Playground focusing on giving students confidence to stand up to others. When a Jelly Had A Wobble entertained Prep Green as they learnt about feeling nervous and how supportive friends can help us through challenging times. Prep Gold read a book about friendship and how to make friends after a quarrel.

The Prep team is proud of the way students engaged with these concepts. Already, teachers are observing the children applying their new learning in the classroom and playground, contributing to a respectful and inclusive school environment.






