The Term 4 Book Club catalogue was distributed to all students on Friday 10th October. If you would like to place an order, it will need to be submitted online by **Friday 31st October**.


All orders are to be completed online. The school office will not be accepting any orders. Once the books have been delivered to the school, they will be sorted and distributed to the students for them to bring home.

Learning Diversity & Student Wellbeing

At St Vincent de Paul Primary school, we continue to explore the Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships (RRRR) program, which helps students develop emotional awareness, empathy, and strong social skills. This term, many of the year levels are focussing on positive coping — learning ways to manage strong feelings and respond to challenges in helpful ways.

Students have been discovering that it's normal to feel emotions like worry, anger, or disappointment and what matters is how we respond. Through stories, discussions, and role plays, children are identifying strategies that help them calm down and feel better, such as:

£ taking slow, deep breaths

kgoing for a walk or having a short break

talking to a trusted adult or friend

doing something creative or relaxing

Positive coping helps children build resilience, the ability to bounce back after tricky moments. In some year levels, we've been practising "name it to tame it" (putting words to feelings), using calm-down corners, and celebrating times when students have managed big emotions in positive ways.

Families can support this learning at home by modelling calm problem-solving, naming your own feelings, and encouraging children to try healthy coping strategies. A simple conversation like, "I can see you're frustrated — what could help you feel calm right now?" helps children feel understood and capable of managing their emotions.

Together, we're helping students grow into confident, caring and resilient learners who can handle life's ups and downs with a positive mindset.

Family activity idea

What to do:

- 1. **Find a small box or container** decorate it together with drawings or stickers.
- 2. Talk about things that help everyone feel calm when they're upset or worried (e.g., reading, listening to music, hugging a pet, going outside, deep breathing).
- 3. Write or draw each coping idea on a card and put it in the box.
- 4. When someone feels upset, **choose a card** from the box to try a positive coping strategy.

Why it helps:

This activity normalises talking about feelings and gives children a practical way to practise self-regulation. It also builds family connection and shared understanding around emotional wellbeing.
