SAFETY

Now that we have been back to school for two weeks it is important for all parents and adults who are dropping off and picking up children using a vehicle, of the expectations. Both Woodland Street and Rosebank Avenue have clearly identified drop off and pick up zones.

During the morning drop-off:

- Drivers should move to the front of the zone to allow space behind for others.
- Students should have their school bags with them, not in the car boot.
- Drivers should remain in the vehicle.
- Drivers should move on as quickly as possible.

During the afternoon pick-up:

- Students should wait towards the front of the zone and be attentive.
- Drivers should move to the front of the zone to allow space behind for others.
- Students should enter the vehicle as quickly as possible.
- Drivers should move on as quickly as possible.

No vehicles should enter the school grounds without prior consent from the Principal. Vehicles should not be entering the Parish tennis court car park to drop off and pick up children. We know that when everyone fulfills these expectations the system works very effectively and efficiently.

Learning Diversity & Student Wellbeing

We hope your children have settled into their school routines for 2026 and are enjoying their new classes and teachers.

Child safety is always the major priority at St Vincent de Paul Primary School. As Catholic educators, we have a moral, mission-driven and legal responsibility to uphold and actively promote the wellbeing and safety of every student entrusted in our care. This year we will take part in the Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) 11 Standards in 11 Months program, promoting and raising awareness of all 11 child safety standards within the school community.

Overview of the Victorian Child Safe Standards

The Victorian Child Safe Standards are a set of 11 minimum requirements that all organisations working with children must meet.

These standards are designed to:

- Prevent child abuse and harm
- Make child safety a shared responsibility
- Support the wellbeing of all children, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and children with disabilities
- Promote the participation and empowerment of children and young people

Our Commitment

Our commitment to the protection of students is enabled in nurturing, respectful and safe communities where the uniqueness and sacred dignity of every young person are celebrated, and they can flourish in their learning and development. This vision is driven by the Gospel message of love, justice and abundance, beautifully reflected in the words of John: *“I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full” (Jn 10:10)*

Child Safe Standard 1 - February Focus

“Establish culturally safe environments in which the diverse and unique identities and experiences of Aboriginal children, young people and students are respected and value”

Child Safe Standard 1 relates to children and young people feeling culturally safe, respected, and valued.

What does this look like in a school environment?

- Celebrating culture: We include and celebrate Aboriginal culture in our classrooms/events e.g. NAIDOC Week, researching stories to share, inviting guest speakers.
- Ongoing development: Our staff receive training and knowledge to better understand and support cultural safety.



Audiri - Update your Group for 2026

Install the App in 4 easy steps!




The free Audiri school app offers parents a convenient way to stay up-to-date with the school calendar, last-minute forms, newsletters, all school communications, and even make cashless payments. With Audiri, you can get started in just a few minutes by following these simple steps:

1. Open the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store and search for 'Audiri'. Install the app.
2. Create an account and follow the prompts. Click 'Sign up'. Enter your email address, create a password and click on 'Sign up'. A confirmation email will be sent to confirm your account. Open the confirmation email and confirm your account.
3. Open the app, and click 'Add/Remove'. Type your school's name and press enter.
4. Tap the + icon to add. Now you can see your school, under My Schools & Services.

2026 Concessional School Fee Policy

Please continue reading to understand if you are eligible for discounted school fees under the 2026 Concessional School Fee Policy (including Health Care Card holders).

CONCESSIONAL SCHOOL FEE POLICY – 2026

- 1 child family \$810 per annum
- 2 child family \$1,240 per annum
- 3+ child family \$1,620 per annum
(Excluding any camp charges)

The following families are encouraged to apply for concessional school fees as outlined in the newly introduced MACS Concessional School Fee Policy contained on our website under: Concessional Fee Policy.

- Any family holding a Health Care Card and eligible for Camps, Sports and Excursions (CSEF)
 - Any family of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander heritage
 - Any family experiencing **severe** financial hardship
 - Any family holding a DVA Gold Card
 - Any family identified as refugees and holding an ImmiCard
- Families who meet one of the above criteria are required to return the below documentation to the office:
- Concessional Fee Application Form
 - A completed direct debit request service agreement
 - A copy of the government concession card (if applicable)
 - A completed Camps, Sports and Excursions (CSEF) application form (if applicable)

2026 Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund (CSEF) helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the cost of school trips, camp and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested **CONCESSION CARD** or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is **\$400** per primary school student.

We would encourage all parents who do have a concession card to apply for this benefit as, apart from receiving the CSEF payment, it also impacts on the school student funding.
