Learning Diversity & Student Wellbeing

Extreme weather

Student wellbeing is always at the forefront of our minds and we know from research that excessive screen time can have a number of damaging effects on children’s development, wellbeing and learning.

This term, we engaged the help of the SRC to conduct a school wide survey with the children, creating a list of games they would like to play during extreme weather days.

The extensive list included Jenga, Guess Who, Uno, Scrabble, Monopoly amongst many other games. We then made a significant purchase and successfully delivered the games to the classrooms. On the few extreme weather days that we have had so far, the effect has been extremely positive, with children spending their time taking turns, sharing and engaging with each other, rather than sitting on devices.

This new ‘no device’ rule during these extreme weather days is just one part of ensuring our children are engaged and ready to learn. We know that screen time can affect social and emotional development by missing out on important face-to-face interactions. These interactions help build communication skills, empathy, and the ability to form strong relationships. Excessive screen use has also been linked to increased irritability, reduced attention span and difficulty managing emotions.

As we head towards the school holidays, it will be important to keep screen time in mind by setting clear limits and encouraging outdoor play and physical activity where possible. By working together, we can help children develop healthy habits with technology whilst supporting their overall wellbeing, learning and development.

Carnevale Italian Day - Tuesday 28th April

We are excited to announce that on **Tuesday 28th April** our school will be celebrating **Carnevale Italian Day!**

Carnevale is a vibrant and colourful celebration traditionally held in Italy before Lent. Cities such as Venice and Viareggio are famous for their spectacular parades, elaborate costumes and beautiful masks. There are many other cities around the world that celebrate Carnevale also, like Goa in India, New Orleans in USA, Rio Janeiro in Brazil, Cologne in Germany and Nice in France. It is a final hurrah before the restrictions of Lent begin on Ash Wednesday. During the celebrations, which can last from a day to a month, revelers are free to eat, drink, and dance before the solemnity of Lent.

On the day, students are invited to come to school dressed in an appropriate **costume of their choice**, (the concept of Carnevale is that you are someone else for the day). They may create a **fantasy costume**, dress as a favourite character, or come as anything they like! (no toy weapons please). There is no need to hire or purchase a costume. If they prefer, students can also dress in the colours of the Italian flag - **green, white and red**. Students will have the opportunity to make their own mask at school.

Some of the activities that students will participate in throughout the day include:

- Mask making
- A festive Carnevale mask parade
- An Italian-themed scavenger hunt
- Watch a theatrical performance
- Dancing
- Playing bocce



This special day will be a wonderful opportunity for students to immerse themselves in Italian culture while practising their language skills in a fun and meaningful way. We look forward to a joyful and colourful celebration of Carnevale together!

We hope this initiative gives you some guidance in safe journeys to and from schools.

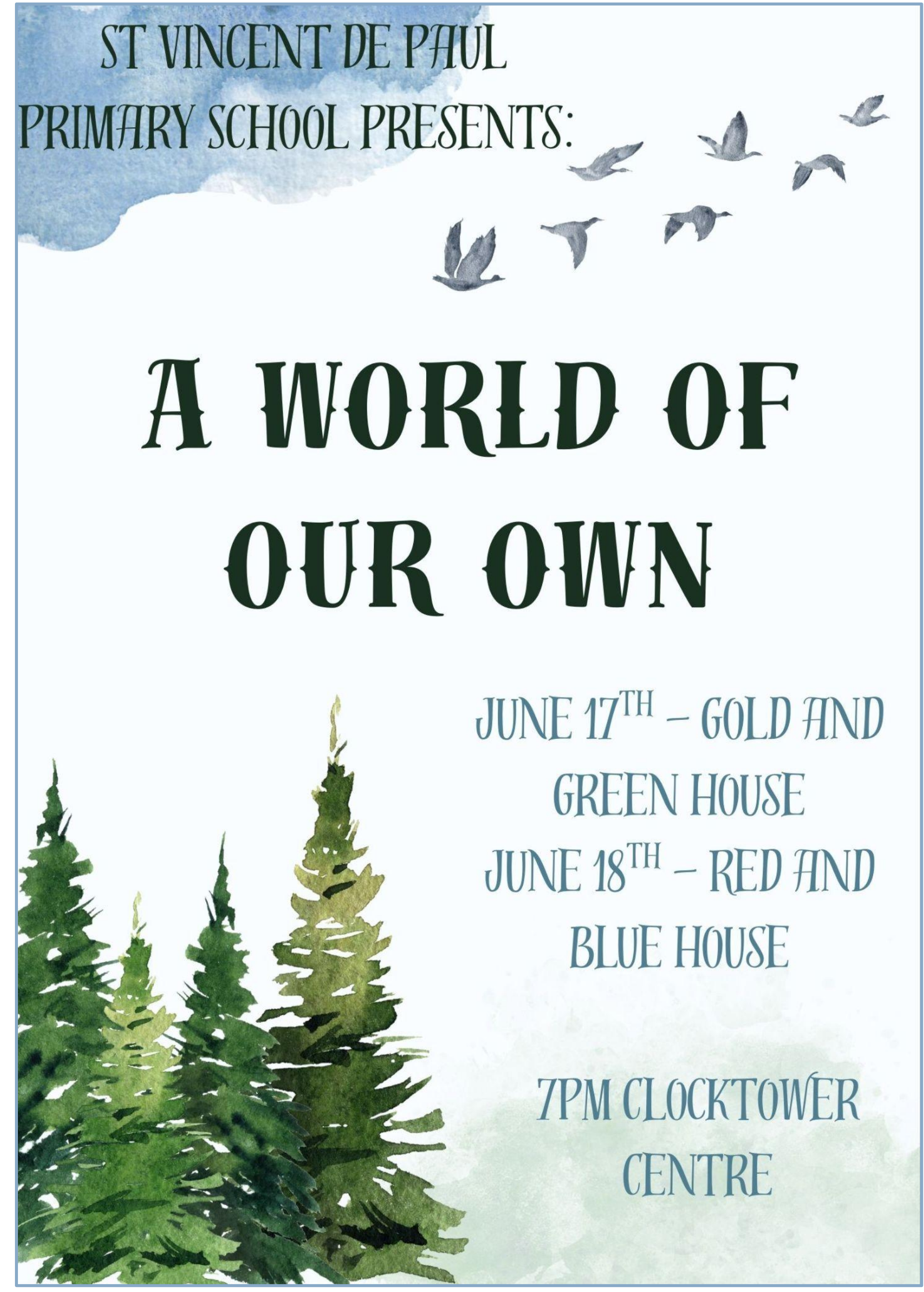


2026 School Concert

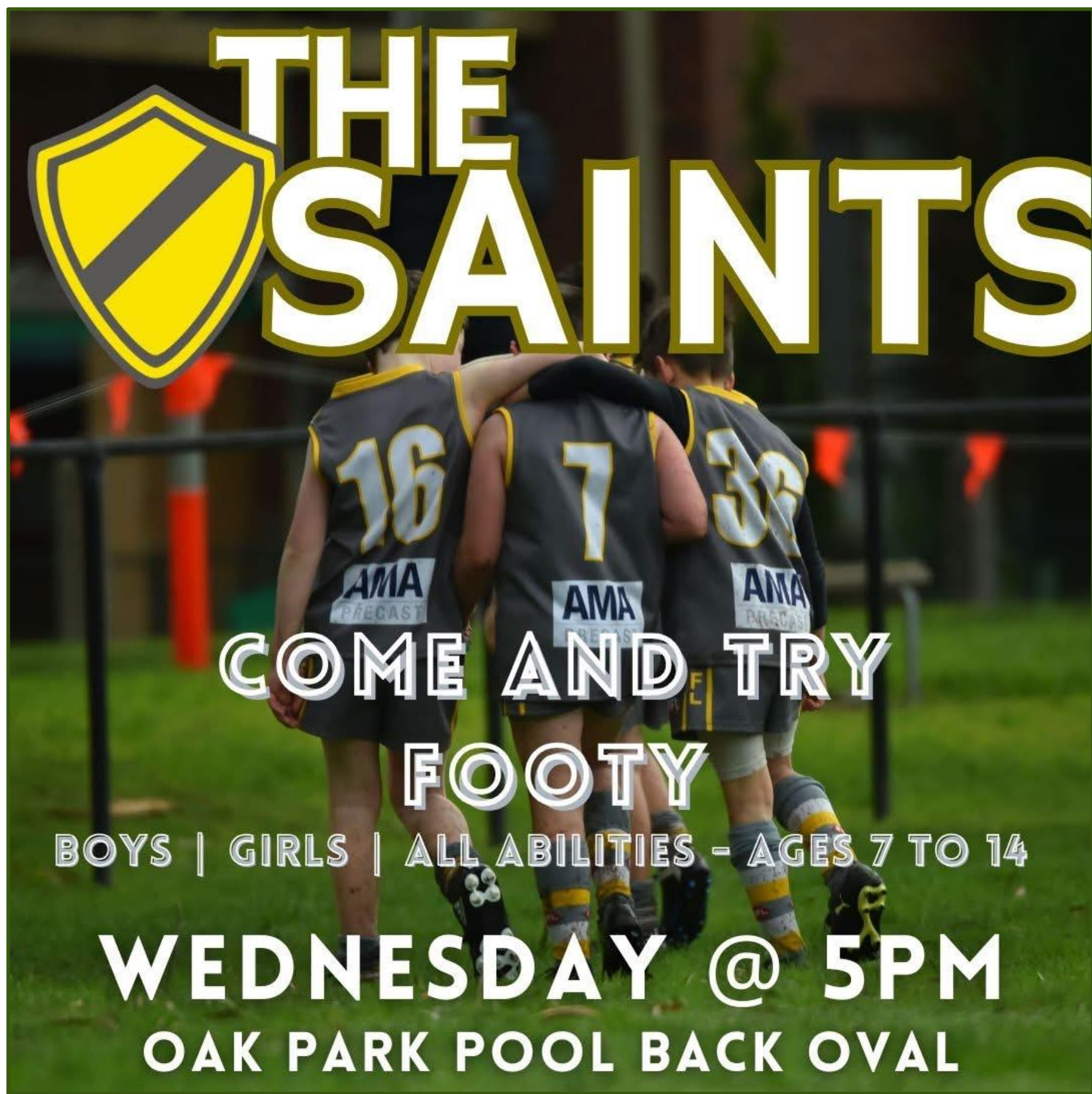
