Reflection



The following reading is from this coming Sunday.

4th Sunday of Easter

1 Peter 2:20-25

'You have come back to the shepherd of your souls'

The merit, in the sight of God, is in bearing punishment patiently when you are punished after doing your duty.

This, in fact, is what you were called to do, because Christ suffered for you and left an example for you to follow the way he took. He had not done anything wrong, and there had been no perjury in his mouth. He was insulted and did not retaliate with insults; when he was tortured he made no threats but he put his trust in the righteous judge. He showed great love by taking our faults upon himself, helping us to turn back to God and live better lives. You had gone astray like sheep but now you have come back to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

This reading reminds us to follow the example of Jesus, who showed patience, forgiveness and trust in God even when he suffered. It teaches us that doing the right thing is important, even when it is difficult or unfair. Like a shepherd cares for and guides sheep, Jesus cares for us, leads us back when we make mistakes, and helps us to live with kindness, courage and holiness each day.



ANZAC Day is commemorated each year on the 25th of April. In 2026, ANZAC Day falls on **Saturday 25th April**. This day continues to hold deep significance as we remember the landing of Australian and New Zealand soldiers at Gallipoli in 1915. It is a time to honour all those who have served and sacrificed in wars, conflicts and peacekeeping missions. We remember their courage, mateship and resilience, and reflect on the freedoms we enjoy today because of their service.

As a school community, we gather to pause, reflect and give thanks.

SCHOOL CONCERT

Wellbeing - 11 Months - 11 Standards

Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) 11 Standards in 11 Months program, promoting and raising awareness of all 11 child safety standards within the school community.

Child Safe Standard 3

‘Children and young people are empowered about their rights, participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously.’

As Catholic educators, we have a moral, mission-driven and legal responsibility to uphold and actively promote the wellbeing and safety of every student entrusted in our care. Our commitment to the protection of students is enabled in nurturing, respectful and safe communities where the uniqueness and sacred dignity of every young person are celebrated, and they can flourish in their learning and development.

Learning Diversity & Student Wellbeing (cont...)

Overview of Child Safe Standard 3:

To be aligned, schools must support the following:

- Children are informed about all their rights, including safety, information and participation
- The importance of friendship is recognized and support from peers is encouraged
- Where relevant to setting or context, young people are offered access to sexual abuse prevention programs in an age-appropriate way
- Staff are attuned to signs of harm and facilitate child friendly ways for children to express their views, participate in decision making and raise their concerns
- Organisations have strategies to develop a culture that facilitates participation and are responsive to input from children and young people

This standard focuses on empowering children and young people by ensuring they are informed, respected, and actively involved in decisions that affect them. This participation helps build a school culture that is safe for them and values their voice.

What does this look like in a school environment?

- **Creating Opportunities for Student Voice:** We create formal structures such as student councils and leadership programs, but we also include fewer formal opportunities so all students, especially the most vulnerable, can have their voice heard.
- **Acting on Student Feedback:** We listen deeply to what students are telling us and we respond to concerns, suggestions and ideas. This includes making sure students are aware when we have acted on their feedback.
- **Building Staff Capacity:** Our staff receive professional learning, so they understand the importance and benefits of listening to and responding to student voice. This also includes training for staff regarding how to incorporate student voice in their daily interactions and decision making.

How Parents, Carers and Guardians can get involved!

- **Listen and talk often:** Encourage your child to share their thoughts and feelings. Let them know it's always ok to speak up.
- **Talk about rights and safety:** Help your child understand that everyone deserves to feel safe and respected.
- **Be a role model:** Show kindness, respect, and inclusion in everyday life, children learn from what they see.
- **Stay connected with the school:** Take part in conversations or surveys about student wellbeing and safety.
- **Support student voice:** Encourage your child to get involved in school activities where their ideas can make a difference.

Carnevale Italian Day - Tuesday 28th April

We are excited to announce that on **Tuesday 28th April** our school will be celebrating **Carnevale Italian Day!**

Carnevale is a vibrant and colourful celebration traditionally held in Italy before Lent. Cities such as Venice and Viareggio are famous for their spectacular parades, elaborate costumes and beautiful masks. There are many other cities around the world that celebrate Carnevale also, like Goa in India, New Orleans in USA, Rio Janeiro in Brazil, Cologne in Germany and Nice in France. It is a final hurrah before the restrictions of Lent begin on Ash Wednesday. During the celebrations, which can last from a day to a month, revelers are free to eat, drink, and dance before the solemnity of Lent.

On the day, students are invited to come to school dressed in an appropriate **costume of their choice**, (the concept of Carnevale is that you are someone else for the day). They may create a **fantasy costume**, dress as a favourite character, or come as anything they like! (no toy weapons please). There is no need to hire or purchase a costume. If they prefer, students can also dress in the colours of the Italian flag - **green, white and red**. Students will have the opportunity to make their own mask at school.

Some of the activities that students will participate in throughout the day include:

- Mask making
- A festive Carnevale mask parade
- An Italian-themed scavenger hunt
- Watch a theatrical performance
- Dancing
- Playing bocce
