



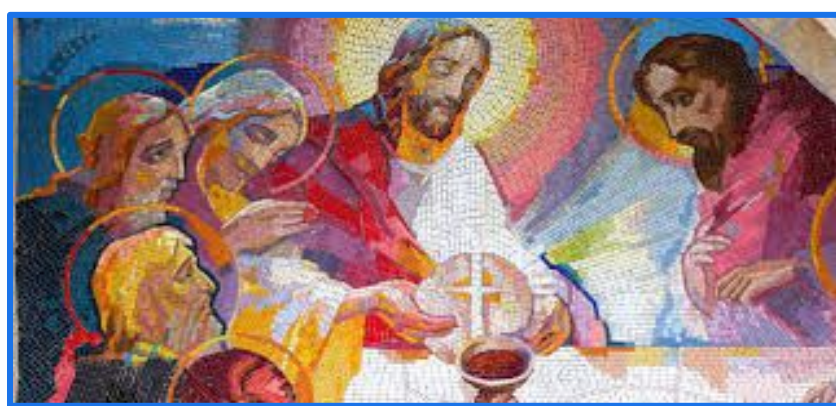

Principal's Message**FIRST HOLY COMMUNION**

Over the past two weekends, our Year 4 children celebrated the Sacrament of First Holy Communion, a significant milestone in their faith journey. Through the support and guidance of their parents, school staff and Fr. Nhan, the children were thoughtfully and thoroughly prepared for this special occasion.

We congratulate all the children who received their First Holy Communion and commend them on taking this important step in their relationship with God.

We extend our sincere gratitude to the staff who supported the children throughout their preparation, particularly their teachers: Melissa Pannell, Nathan Zuccarelli, Giulia Costanzo, Holly Caven, and Antoinette McKinnon. We also thank Fr. Nhan for his spiritual guidance and ongoing support of the children and their families during this meaningful time.

The children will receive their sacramental certificates at the parish Mass at 6:00 pm on Saturday, 20 June.

NEW LITERACY LEADER

The school is excited to announce the appointment of our new Literacy Leader. Bianca Terranova will be joining the staff at the beginning of Term 3. Bianca is currently teaching at St. Christopher's Primary School in Airport West. In her previous roles she has been a Literacy Leader and brings with her a wealth of experience and knowledge. We congratulate Bianca on her appointment and look forward to her sharing her many talents with the school community.

SCHOOL CONCERT

It has been great to see the support by our families for the school concert, with very few tickets remaining for this special event. The children are fine tuning their performances which will take place in a fortnight's time.

Children are required arrive at the Clocktower between 6:00-6:15pm where they will make their way upstairs and will be supervised by staff. Parents are not permitted into the upstairs areas.

The kiosk will be open for food and drinks for parents and friends to enjoy whilst waiting for the production to begin at 7:00pm. The children will be attending the venue for their final practice on Wednesday June 17 throughout the day. The excitement the production is creating can be felt throughout the school and no doubt that will be evident on the night. We understand that children will be nervous and sometimes that can be expressed in hesitation and worry. However, in our experience, when all the children are together and perform their part of the production, the energy and excitement they feel after achieving the feat is something they never forget.

INSTALLATION OF PARISH PRIEST MASS

On Sunday 21 June, Archbishop Peter Comensoli will celebrate the 10:30am Mass at St Monica's Church. This special Mass will mark the official installation of Fr. Nhan as Parish Priest of both St. Vincent's and St. Monica's Parishes.

We warmly invite all families to join us for this significant occasion as we celebrate Fr. Nhan's appointment and support him as he formally begins his ministry within our parish communities. Your presence will be a wonderful sign of welcome, encouragement and unity as we gather together in faith to mark this important milestone.

PICK UP AND DROP OFF ZONES

As a reminder, the Pink Zone operates as a drop-off and pick-up only area between 8:00–9:00am and 3:00–4:00pm. Parking is not permitted during these times. To ensure the zone operates efficiently and safely, we ask that parents remain in their vehicles while children enter or exit. The system works well when everyone follows the established procedures.

Unfortunately, there are still occasions where these expectations are not being followed. In some cases, grandparents, relatives, or family friends who are dropping off or collecting children may not have been made aware of the procedures. If someone else is responsible for transporting your child, please ensure they understand how the system operates and follow the street signage, which clearly indicates the designated zones.

Student safety remains our highest priority. Last year, one of our students was struck by a vehicle, and on Wednesday there was a near miss involving students from our school. These incidents serve as an important reminder that we must all remain vigilant. Every member of our community has a role to play in keeping our children safe, including the students themselves. When crossing Woodland Street, families should use either the supervised crossing operated by the crossing supervisor or the pedestrian traffic lights at the corner of Napier and Woodland Streets.

As a reminder for our current families who have a child who will be starting Prep in 2027, please ensure you have completed the response confirming your child's acceptance of the offer by Friday, June 19.

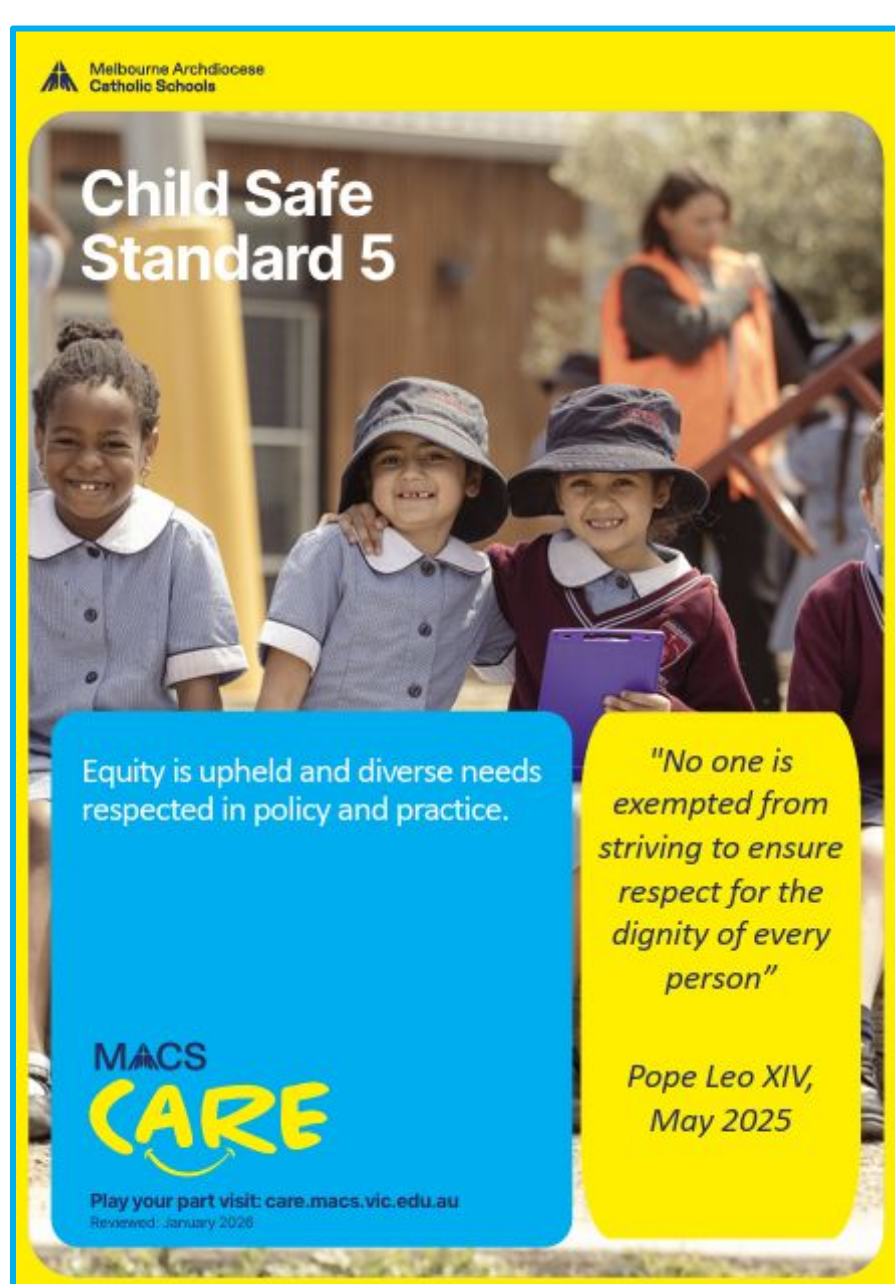

Transport Victoria Roadworks

Transport Victoria have commenced essential work on a 375 metre stretch of Woodland Street, between Carnarvon Road and Salmon Avenue.

They will be removing 16 of 31 trees. All 16 trees will be replaced with a species of eucalyptus tree which will retain the native tree character of the area while significantly reducing the risk of future damage.

Works commenced on **Tuesday 2 June** and will run through to **early July 2026**.

- Tree removal and concrete works will occur between **7.00am and 6.00pm weekdays**.
- Road profiling and asphalt works will follow in the evenings (**8.00pm – 6.00am**) **Sunday to Thursday**, taking about two weeks to complete.

These dates are subject to favourable weather conditions and the contractor’s program of works.

What to expect during works

- Road and lane closures will be in place at different stages to enable work to occur safely.
- Detours will be in place when Woodland Street is closed. Please follow all traffic management signage and traffic controllers.
- There will also be some impact to parking, and we will try to keep this to a minimum. A member of their team will contact impacted residents ahead of any parking or access changes.
- Residents and emergency service vehicles will be guided through the work zone as required.
- Medium to high level noise is expected during tree removal and when crews remove the surface layers of the road. Low to medium levels of noise are expected during other works.
- For the safety of road users and workers, reversing beepers are required on all machinery.
- A reduced speed limit will be in place through the work zone to ensure the safety of crews and all road users.



Unexpected changes to activities

In the unlikely event that an activity is unable to run, an alternative activity will be provided.

Activities and times are subject to change due to unforeseen circumstances such as severe weather or provider availability. If an alternative cannot be sourced we will update your invoice to reflect this.

General daily advertised activities are subject to change due to unforeseen circumstances, at the discretion of the service coordinator.

Serious stuff!

Medical Management Plan & Medication

All children who have been diagnosed with a medical condition including allergies, food/chemical intolerances, anaphylaxis, asthma, epilepsy will need to provide:

- a completed Medical Management Plan with a colour photo
- necessary medication

Please note it is a legal requirement under the Education & Care National Regulations and the Terms and Conditions for booking that these are provided.

In the interests of child safety, care may be refused on the day should the appropriate documentation or medication or medication not be supplied.

Child Care Subsidy

Please note that subsidised hours are calculated and allocated by Centrelink on a fortnightly basis. Check Centrelink for eligibility.

Fortnightly childcare subsidised hours

Each session is calculated using the full service operational hours, not the hours attended by the child.

Additional Child Care subsidy will not cover any hours beyond the subsidised hours per fortnight.

When making additional bookings, the \$10.00 fee is eligible for the Child Care Subsidy, which means you may only need to pay the gap, depending on your families' circumstances.
