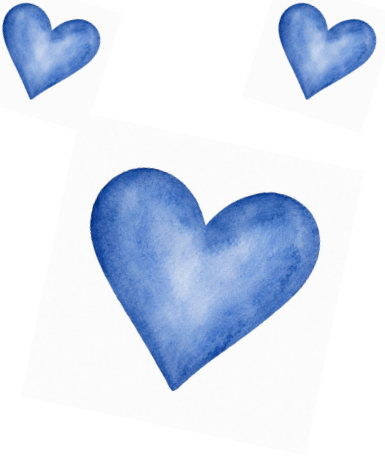

Principal’s Message

FATHER’ S DAY

BUILDING UPDATE

The construction of the new classroom has been postponed, with works originally scheduled to commence this term. Prior to the commencement of the project, a number of additional costs were identified that were not included in the original tender.

Unfortunately, these additional costs would make the project financially unviable, as the overall cost would exceed the school’s current borrowing capacity. Following consultation with Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS), the school has therefore made the decision to put the project out to tender again, with the aim of securing a more financially sustainable outcome.

As a result, construction of the new classroom will now commence in 2027. While this is disappointing, we believe retendering the project is the most responsible approach to ensure the development can proceed without placing undue financial pressure on the school.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT SURVEYS

This week all families should have received an email with a link and PIN to access the Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools – School Improvement Surveys (MACSSIS). MACSSIS is a set of surveys that have been built specifically for Catholic schools in Melbourne by the Learning Services team at MACS. The results from the surveys provide important information for our school and help guide our goals for the coming year(s). We would encourage all families to take the time to complete the survey. The more people who complete it the greater the accuracy of the data collected.

Nurturing a Safe and Caring Community:
Child Safe Standard 8

As Catholic educators, we have a moral, mission-driven, and legal responsibility to uphold and actively promote the wellbeing and safety of every student in our care. Grounded in our Catholic mission, we are called to act with wisdom, care, and integrity. A crucial part of living out this commitment is **Child Safe Standard 8**, which ensures that our staff and volunteers are equipped with the knowledge, skills, and awareness to keep children safe through ongoing education and training. Child Safe Standard 8 is often described as the "capability engine" of all the standards. Without a strong, resourced commitment to continuous learning, policies cannot operate effectively in practice. Safeguarding is not static; it requires constant reflection, skill development, and awareness of evolving risks and legislative obligations.

Why Standard 8 Matters

Children and young people are safest when the adults around them understand how to recognize risk, respond effectively to concerns, and foster environments that promote respect and inclusion. By providing regular, role-appropriate training, our school ensures adults act consistently, early, and with compassion.

The Impact on Our Students

- When our staff and volunteers receive ongoing education, our students:
- **Are Better Protected:** Adults quickly recognize early indicators of harm or risk.
 - **Receive Consistent Care:** Concerns are met with timely, appropriate responses.
 - **Feel Respected and Understood:** Learning fosters culturally safe, inclusive environments.
 - **Flourish Daily:** Safeguarding becomes an active, embedded part of everyday school life.
- By continually growing in our own knowledge and skills, we build a confident, well-informed community where every child feels secure, valued, and supported to reach their full potential. Thank you for partnering with us to keep our school community safe!

Bringing Feelings to Life: Introducing Kimochis in Prep to Y2

This term, our Junior School classrooms have welcomed some wonderful new friends: **Kimochis**!

Kimochi (key-MO-chee) is the Japanese word for "feeling," and the Kimochis program is a fun, research-backed social-emotional learning tool designed to help young children understand, express, and manage their emotions.

Learning how to navigate big feelings is a major milestone for children in Prep, Year 1, and Year 2. To help them build these essential life skills, we have introduced six plush Kimochi characters into our daily classroom routines:

- **Cloud:** Teaches children how to handle unpredictable moods and stay calm.
- **Bug:** Helps students practice bravery and try new things even when they feel shy.
- **Huggtopus:** Focuses on setting healthy physical boundaries and learning when to slow down.
- **Cat:** Demonstrates how to be a good leader while managing frustration when things don't go to plan.
- **Lovey Dove:** Models kindness, gentle words, and peacemaking during disagreements.
- **Bella Rose:** Helps children practice sensitivity, managing big emotions, and expressing feelings in a sweet, thoughtful way.

Each character carries small, soft "feeling pillows" in a pouch, representing emotions like *happy, sad, mad, scraped hurt*, or *brave*.

Coming Soon to Our Classrooms! Our Kimochi family is growing! We will soon be introducing **Clover** (who helps children learn about optimism, luck, and overcoming mistakes) and **Hero** (who encourages resilience, doing the right thing, and helping others).

How We Use Them in the Classroom

Through interactive storytelling, role-play, and circle time, teachers use the Kimochis to teach practical self-regulation strategies. Students learn:

- **Emotional Literacy:** Giving name and color to what they feel inside, making big emotions less overwhelming.
- **Communication Skills:** Using a "talking voice" instead of a "screaming voice" or shutting down when upset.
- **Conflict Resolution:** Practicing simple positive scripts (like "Rewind" or "Take a deep breath") to work through playground disagreements.

By bringing these characters into everyday learning, we are giving our youngest students a shared language for their feelings, fostering empathy, and creating a supportive environment where every child feels heard. Keep an eye out, your child might just introduce you to their favorite Kimochi character at home!

Celebrating Stories, Culture, and Language: Indigenous Literacy Day

On the first Wednesday of September, our school community joins together to celebrate **Indigenous Literacy Day (ILD)**. Organised annually by the Indigenous Literacy Foundation (ILF), this important day highlights the richness of First Nations stories, cultures, and languages while promoting literacy equity for children in remote Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities across Australia.

This year’s national theme is **"Country Is Our Teacher"**. It reminds us that for First Nations peoples, literacy extends beyond books on a shelf, it encompasses deep connections to the land, sea, sky, oral traditions, and languages passed down through generations

Why Indigenous Literacy Day Matters

In remote parts of Australia, access to culturally relevant books and learning resources in first languages can be limited. Indigenous Literacy Day calls attention to this gap and celebrates the work being done to ensure every child has access to quality literature that reflects their identity, language, and background. When children see their own culture and language represented in books, it fosters pride, deepens belonging, and builds a strong foundation for lifelong learning.

How You Can Support at Home

- **Read Together:** Seek out children’s books by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander authors and illustrators at your local library or bookstore.
- **Talk About Country:** Encourage your child to share what they’ve learned at school about the Traditional Custodians of the land on which we live and play.
- **Support the ILF:** Consider making a small donation or participating in local book swap events that support the Indigenous Literacy Foundation’s work in supplying books to remote communities.

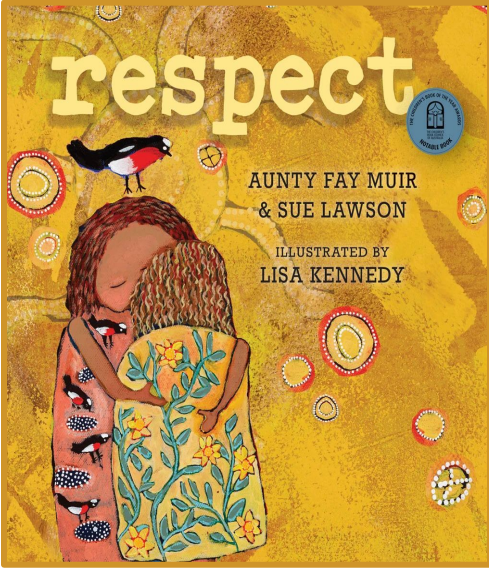
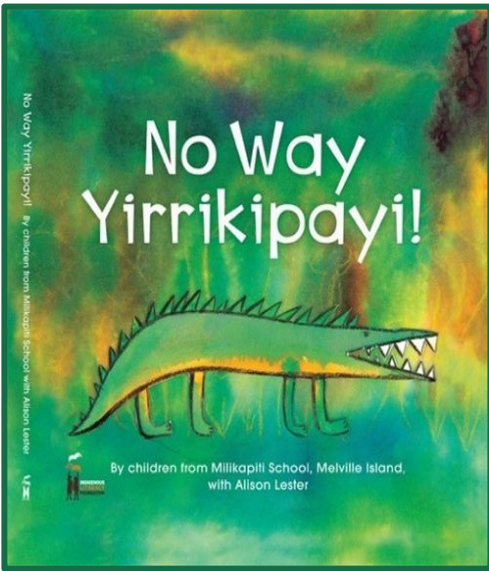
Some recommended books include:

"Welcome to Country" by Aunty Joy Murphy Wandin & Lisa Kennedy, A beautifully illustrated invitation to the traditional lands of the Wurundjeri people.

"Respect" by Aunty Fay Muir & Sue Lawson — A gentle story introducing young children to First Nations values of care, community, and respect for Country.

"No Way Yirrikipayi!" by Alison Lester & the Children of Tiwi College — A fun, interactive story about a hungry crocodile on the Tiwi Islands.

By sharing and honoring First Nations stories, we enrich our entire school community and take meaningful steps toward a more inclusive future.
